Crossover Baby Blanket

Skill Level

Easy

Finished Size

Approx 30" x 40" (76cm x 102cm)

Materials



- Willow Yarns™ Burrow Worsted (75% acrylic/25% wool, 100g/197yd)
-730001-0068 Concrete (2 balls): A
-730001-0031 Lavender (4 balls): B
- US size J-10 (6mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle

Gauge

13 sts x 9½ rows = 4" (10.2 cm)
Save time, check your gauge.

Stitch Guide

FPtr (Front Post treble crochet): Yo twice, insert hook right to left behind designated st, yo, pull up lp, (yo, pull through 2 lps) 3 times.

Pattern Notes

- Beg ch 3 counts as dc unless otherwise indicated.
- Change color every row. To change colors, work row to end, leave last 2 lps on hook, pick up new color, yo, pull through both lps on hook. Cut previous color.
- Weave in ends as you go or every 10 rows.

Instructions

With A, ch 99.

Row 1 (WS): Working in bottom bump of ch across, sc in second ch from hook, sc in each ch to end, change to B, turn—98 sc.

Row 2: Ch 3, *sk next 2 sc, dc in next sc, ch 1, dc in first sk sc; rep from * to last sc, dc in last sc, change to A, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each dc and ch-1 sp to end, change to B, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, sk next 2 sc, FPtr in next dc 2 rows below, ch 1, working behind FPtr just made, dc in first sk sc, *sk 1 dc 2 rows below, FPtr in next dc 2 rows below, ch 1, working behind FPtr just

made, sk 2 sc from last dc just made, dc in next sc; rep from * to last sc, dc in last sc, change to A, turn.

Rows 5-94: Rep Rows 3-4.

Row 95: Rep Row 3.

Side Edges

With A, and RS facing, attach yarn to top left corner. Working on long edge, ch 1, sc in first st, *2 sc in dc bar, sc in end sc; rep from * to end—142 sc. Fasten off. Rep for opposite long edge.

Finishing

Weave in ends, block.
